Higher Level Thinking Across the Curriculum: Education Central

The intent of any curriculum is to develop knowledge and skills to support pupils to have a deep understanding of the area of study. This course will develop practitioners' abilities to inject higher level thinking skills into lessons for all learners.

Through a series of carefully crafted practical activities, delegates will explore how higherlevel thinking skills can be developed. Starting with Fisher's Four Levels of Learning model, delegates will learn how to embed higher order thinking skills across the curriculum, so that learners can engage deeply with ambitious content and are well equipped to be able to build on it in future.

Teachers will leave:

- Having improved questioning techniques to probe and support learning
- Clear about a range of techniques they can put into practice in their next lesson
- With a framework to support school-based discussion on the use of questioning to promote deeper learning

Mastering Mathematics in KS1: Education Central

'The principal focus of mathematics teaching in key stage 1 is to ensure that pupils develop confidence and mental fluency with whole numbers, counting and place value.' National Curriculum 2014.

Through this course, previously rated 'outstanding' by 100% of delegates, teachers will be supported to see how the knowledge, skills and understanding required in the programme of study build on prior learning and provide the foundations for future learning. The practical activities within the course will help teachers to ensure that key skills are really mastered, allowing pupils to go on to achieve the highest possible standards at the end of year two and beyond.

Facilitators will share a range of techniques teachers can use to modify common mathematical tasks to ensure mastery and ensure delegates leave:

- equipped to teach for mastery;
- buzzing with ideas;
- confident to promote reasoning in every maths lesson; and
- with a renewed confidence in of how to cater for higher attaining groups of pupils, particularly those expected to reach greater depth.

SEND Training: Faye Whittle, Inclusion Consultant

These meetings will focus on the four broad areas of need as identified within the SEND Code of Practice (2015).

Thursday 5th December 2019 - Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs

These are pupils who may experience a wide range of difficulties demonstrated in several ways such as being isolated, withdrawn or by displaying challenging behaviours. These pupils may also have underlying mental health difficulties such as eating disorders, anxiety and / or depression. Included could be pupils experiencing Attachment Disorder or Attention Deficit Disorder.

Wednesday 14th January 2020 - Communication and Interaction Needs

These pupils will be experiencing difficulties with one or more aspect of speech, language and/or communication. This could include pupils with Autism.

Monday 3rd February 2020 - Cognition and Learning Needs

These are pupils who need additional support for learning compared to their peers. This could include pupils with moderate learning difficulties or specific learning difficulties such as Dyslexia.

Wednesday 29th April 2020 - Physical and / or Sensory Needs

These pupils may have a disability that prevents or hinders them from making use of the educational facilities generally provided. This could include hearing and / or visual impairments.

Teaching for Mastery - The English Curriculum:

Education Central

Opportunities for children to explore connections that can be made between reading and writing in clear and purposeful sequences of lessons are essential to allow children to master their understanding of English within the programmes of study.

This course will enable delegates to reflect deeply on their current approach to the teaching of English, considering text selection and a wide range of activities to engage all pupils. Sophisticated strategies to challenge pupils when reading and writing will be shared. The session will support delegates to utilise these strategies to promote both the expected standard and greater depth within their learning sequences. This year the course will also feature feedback from previous delegates and the impact the ideas have had on their classrooms.
