NQT +1 (Previously RQTs) - led by Sam Cosgrove

The Department for Education have recognised that NQT's +1 will need support due to the limitations placed on them by the pandemic and as such are funding schools so that they may continue to develop their NQT's +1. This is the equivalent of an extra 5% PPA time.

Teachers new to role have had an unprecedented level of disruption to their training and first year of teaching. This course will support those new to the profession in ensuring that they are given all the tools possible to become the very best teachers of the future. Using the Early Career Framework tools, and the BDMAT Teaching and Learning toolkit. We will unpick quality first teaching and determine how this exemplified in their day to day practice.
